Northeastern Pennsylvania was hit with flash flooding in the beginning of September 2011. This included areas in which TriCorps Security maintains both stationary sites and roving units. Locations were under water and roads had been washed away. TriCorps Security employee Rick Rogers was on duty the evening the Susquehanna River crested and flooded both the Towanda and Athens Boroughs in Pennsylvania. This area was classified as under a State of Emergency by the National Guard. This prevented some employees from being able to report for duty, and Rick being able to make it to his home. Rick volunteered to stay and work the day shift after just working the night shift to ensure our client maintained visibility, as many sites as possible were checked for damage, find alternate routes to and from sites and assist emergency response teams if needed throughout this period. Rick’s initiative and critical thinking played vital roles in the safety of our client’s sites, and the lives of citizens affected by this natural disaster.
